





Dear Applicant:

Brief Project Description:

Our Lions Club is dedicated to serve those in need in our area. Our theme is "To Serve". Our 5 major focus areas include: the blind, diabetes, hunger, environment, and pediatric illness (such as cancer). All our funds collected are dedicated toward these services.

We are blessed to own our Five Senses Park at 6535 Ward Road. It includes our club house, pavilion, gazebo, pergola, and our lake, within our 14 acres.

- 1. Improve our existing pond from over growth and add design features to **increase safe access for use, which includes the blind** we bring to the site for events. This is both for safety for the blind and protection of an environmental resource. That includes safety fencing and rails.
- 2. Add a dock/platform to help the blind have access, fish, and experience being by the water safely. To add an audio feature for the blind, a fountain will be added into the pond.
- 3. Add a functional safety path to allow/assist the blind to experience a nature walk. The path would leave from the Pavilion, through the pergola, to the lakes dock platform, then over the bridge, and into the fields of our 14 acres Five Senses Park. The path would be made of wood chips or playground rubber for safety and reduced maintenance. The path would have railings to guide the blind safely. Along the way would be recording units to describe experiences along the way and braille messages. Experiences would include the feels, smells and sounds of nature. Stations include the pond and a new installed fountain to both keep the pond fresh and provide water sounds. Other stations would include flowers and herbs for taste smell and feel. Children would have further senses experiences in the playground.

Deck and Dock \$18,000

Pond Fountain \$4,000


